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Spotlight On...Amy Matthews, Coventry University Scarborough Campus

The education team at CU Scarborough is a small but diverse group of experienced professionals. Our team is relatively new as most of us have been here for less than 18 months, which only brings enthusiasm and excitement about how we can develop our provision further. We recognise that Teaching Assistants are the highly-skilled, committed, resilient and essential backbone of any school and we want to do all that we can in order to support schools to celebrate, strengthen and maintain this valued group of practitioners. The conference in June is an exciting opportunity to meet with many of you and explore how we can facilitate training and collaboration in the future with the TA network. For example, you and your leadership teams may feel that if in the future we came out to your school and offered some CPD as an outreach project, it might be easier to join in whilst juggling your other commitments. We currently offer a Primary Education & Teaching Studies BA (Hons) degree. Many of our enrolled students simultaneously work as teaching assistants whilst studying with us. You can explore our range of courses and degree subjects on our website, www.coventry.ac.uk/cus.

Unlike traditional universities, CU campuses offer multiple intakes throughout the year, usually taking place in September, November, January, March, May and/or July. At CU, there are no end-of-year exams, so assessments are usually in the form of course works, which not only takes the pressure off students and academics but also gives a more practical approach to learning. At CU, students learn one module at a time. This allows students and academics to delve deeper into the subject matter and focus entirely on course specifics.

As we have a strong emphasis on skills and practice within the programmes, students' experiences are invaluable for colleagues and for our wider team. We are therefore very pleased to be developing this new collaboration and meeting with many of you in person. We look forward to working together.
